This is a 4-day, 3-night adventure camp where kids will get to experience a number of outdoor and indoor activities while having a lot of fun.




Waxing and Waning of the Moon.- AUJAO Activity

Studen<mark>ts across</mark> all branches of Ashoka Group of Schools and their parents benefitted from the knowledge that was imparted during the daylong event.








Mast. Arnav Kotkar - Selection at VROOC

School Enterprise Challenge 2022filver Level Award







Students can demonstrate to colleges their knowledge and their ability to apply it by taking the college board's widely respected SAT test for college admission. A standardised exam that evaluates reading, writing, math, and vocabulary is the SAT. The purpose of the test is to gauge a student's capacity for using newly learnt information in the abilities they have developed during their education. Over 1 million students take the SAT each year, making it the most popular admissions test in the United States. It has been used for college admission. The SAT is typically taken by students in grades 11 or 12, however some take it as early as 10th grade. Many colleges throughout the world and nearly all colleges and universities in the United States use the SAT to make decision.

The reading, writing, and math skills tested on the SAT are the same ones taught in high school classrooms. Success in college and beyond depends on a student's knowledge and abilities in these topics.

Reading passages and sentence completions are included in the critical reading part.

A brief essay and multiple-choice questions on spotting faults and enhancing grammar and usage are included in the writing part.

Mathematical concepts including arithmetic operations, algebra, geometry, statistics, and probability are covered in this part.

The SAT is divided into two categories: SAT 1 and SAT 2. A general exam that evaluates students' verbal, writing, and arithmetic skills is the SAT 1. The subject-specific SAT 2 is appropriate for students who want to show their mastery of a particular subject. Typically, SAT 1 scores are enough to enrol in college courses.

By October 2022, the SAT will still be administered on paper. However, as a result of the switch to test-optional college admissions, fewer students took the SAT than in previous years. SAT will completely transition to digital beginning in 2023 in order to address this issue and remain current with post-covid standards. The exam is entirely digital, and the time limit has been lowered to two hours.

Changes in the procedure of the test:

Since the practise of students filling in bubbles during exams is becoming dated, the SAT will henceforth be entirely digital. The digital exam is a significant improvement that is intended to improve testing security and convenience for test-takers.

Students have the option of taking the exam on either their own laptop or tablet or one provided by the institution. Before the test day, the pupils must download a digital testing app. Even in the event that a student's computer malfunctions or they lose internet access, this testing tool ought to maintain their progress.

International students will be allowed to take the SAT online starting in the spring of 2023 with the assistance of the designated proctors at schools or testing facilities.

The SAT Exam will last two hours rather than three. There will only be two portions now—a reading and writing section and a math section—instead of four. The reading portion of the SAT will consist of shorter sections, and students are required to respond to one question per passage. Additionally, the arithmetic questions will be "less wordy."

These adjustments make sure that pupils don't just accept information as fact; they remain informed and establish their own judgments. Additionally, test-takers will have additional time to answer the questions.

Both calculator and non-calculator math are covered in sections of the SAT 2022. The most recent SAT 2023 format, however, permits students to utilise calculators during the entire arithmetic section. For students who don't have their own calculators, the digital testing app includes a graphic calculator. This removes the obstacle for students and educational institutions with little resources.

Through the digital version of the testing app, SAT also intends to add a number of tools, such as a timer, a cheat sheet, and a flagging tool to indicate which questions still need to be reviewed.

Meaning of Martial Law

Martial law is the imposition of direct military control of normal civil functions or suspension of civil law by a government, especially in response to an emergency where civil forces are overwhelmed, or in an occupied territory. Martial law can be used by governments to enforce their rule over the public, as seen in multiple countries. Martial law may be declared in cases of major natural disasters, terrorism, national/ general emergency etc.... however, most countries use a different legal construct, such as a state of emergency.

Martial law has also been imposed during conflicts, and in cases of occupations, where the absence of any other civil government provides for an unstable population.

Typically, the imposition of martial law accompanies curfews; the suspension of civil law, civil rights, and habeas corpus; and the application or extension of military law or military justice to civilians. Civilians defying martial law may be subjected to military tribunal/justice.





Advantages of martial law

- 1. Martial law allows the military to swiftly act on internal threats like insurgency, communal riots, rebellions and like sorts that will act as a clear and present danger to the stability of the citizens, government, economy, public safety etc...
- 2. Martial law can reduce or terminate the militancy of any country, maintaining the public stability.
- 3. Under martial law, some civil rights are also suspended. Like free mobility, imposition of curfew, check points, warrantless arrest, holding of suspects longer than 72 hours, tactical search without court warrant among others etc but the suspension period is less and does not have any personal intentions.



Disadvantages of martial law

- 1. The declaration had made people mute; for a moment there's no freedom of the press.
- 2. The right of the people to speak and share their opinion in that current situation was totally denied and deprived. Controlling the people around them.
- 3. If things don't go as they were planned, military might take some decision which would be quite disturbing or maybe undesirable.

In the United States martial law has been declared for a state or other locality under various circumstances including after a direct foreign attack (Hawaii after the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbour)


