


#### New Age Careers in Science

circles. Its popularity has grown over the years, and companies have started implementing data science techniques to grow their business and increase customer satisfaction.



The next, most in-demand and ever-thriving career is ethical hacking and cyber-security. Ethical hacking is the authorised practice of detecting vulnerabilities in an organisation's system. Security experts assume the role of an unauthorised user and attempt to gain access to a private network or computer. These exercises are preventive measures against a real cyberattack.



If your favourite subjects include biology and physics, then I present to you: biophysics! As the name suggests, a biophysicist is a scientist who specialises in the application of physics to biology. In fascinating choice. this career biophysicists develop and use computer modelling methods to see and manipulate the shapes and structures of proteins, viruses and other complex molecules, to develop new drug targets, or understand how proteins mutate and cause tumours to grow.

Last but not the least, enthuse yourself in the thought-provoking field of nutrigenetics. Nutrigenetics is the study of how genetic variations impact how people respond to diet. The goal of nutrigenetics is to use this information to develop personalised nutrition recommendations to help people achieve optimal health and prevent disease.

Exploring such career choices fundamentally expands your knowledge, for research is the first step. Most importantly : If you are still debating over selecting a career for yourself, remember to chase your passion, not money. 
It's like it was everybody's world, but mine.

### Book Review

Paulo Coelho's *The Alchemist*, published in 1988, is a widely translated international bestseller with over 150 million copies sold. At first glance, the premise seems simple: a young shepherd named Santiago sets out on a journey to find treasure buried near the Egyptian pyramids. However, beneath this seemingly straightforward tale lies a profound exploration of dreams, destiny, omens, and growth. What makes it so special?

Coelho's writing is clear and direct, avoiding the overly complex or philosophical tones one might expect from a story about pursuing dreams. Instead, he offers a fable-like narrative that is universal in its message: the pursuit of our dreams, or what the novel calls our "Personal Legend," gives life meaning.

Santiago's journey is not just a physical quest but a spiritual and an emotional one. Along the way, he encounters various characters—a king, a crystal merchant, an English alchemist who offer him guidance and insight. Through these encounters, Coelho subtly weaves in reflections on self-discovery, fear, and the courage it takes to follow through on one's dreams.

One of the novel's most compelling elements, and my personal favorite,

is its focus on intuition and the idea that *The universe conspires* to help those in pursuit of their dreams. This theme, while idealistic, is delivered with sincerity. It invites readers to reflect on their own paths, the barriers they face, and the inner wisdom they often overlook.

Whether it's the fear of failure or the need to listen to one's heart, Coelho captures these universal struggles with grace and empathy.

Ultimately, The Alchemist is a novel that speaks to the dreamer in all of us. It is not a guide to solving life's problems but a gentle reminder of the importance of following ones inner calling, no matter how elusive or distant it may seem. Its simplicity is a part of its charm, offering readers a space to pause and reflect on what truly matters to them.


