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


Any Day when you are in Pajamas the time is a Good Time- Pajama Party:

World Conservation Day:




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Jane Austen 21st Century Reader's Award:

One of our educators- Ms. Jignyasa Panesar bagged the Jane Austen 21st Century Reader's Award.








Climate Action Project Excellence Award:



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
Dance Laurels:




Elocution Competition:


Language is the reflection of culture, character and the growth of its speakers.





Eid -Ul -Adha Mubarak! - Celebrating 'The Feast of Sacrifice'



The students wore army uniforms and traditional dresses to pay tribute and celebrated the day with utmost sincerity.














Ashadi Ekadashi:



Here is an example -CUBES is an acronym that our smart Ashokites use to solve challenging word problems.



His whole life entangled in an answer of a question – WHO AM I? His dignity, his destination and his ambitions, they all seemed to be linked with the answer of this question.
